## **Summary**

## *Ulvsbygden* – a suggested interpretation *By Lennart Elmevik*

Ulvsbygden is the name, as yet uninterpreted, of a settled area (bygd) within Almunge parish in Uppland, some 30 km east of Uppsala. Judging from its oldest known written form, Ulsum (dative plural), which is found in several 14th-century records, the earliest Old Swedish nominative form may be assumed to have been \*Ulsar or \*Ulsir. Lars Hellberg suggested in 1967 that the name originally referred to a village, within the area, that has since disappeared. The present author believes that \*Ulsar, -ir, which would later provide the name for the area as a whole, is based on a river name OSw. \* $\bar{U}$ ls(a). This he regards as formed with an -s suffix from an Old Scandinavian counterpart of the adjective ul 'tainted, musty, rancid; foul-smelling', known from Swedish and Norwegian dialects.
